Shelter & Housing

We work closely with local nonprofit organizations to help those who are struggling to meet their most basic needs.

The Port Ministries

We have partnered with The Port Ministries for many years by donating lunches for their Bread Truck, providing volunteers for annual events, donating goods as well as monetary support. We're proud to support their programs and services to the communities they serve in the form of their free daily Bread Truck, free health clinic, after school programs, and more.

BEDS

Over the years, we have partnered with BEDS (Building Ecumenical Discipleship through Sheltering) by donating meals, laundry kits and monetary donations. Our most recent donation assisted with the opening of their new Summit Service Center. This shelter offers medical care and housing for the unhoused that require additional care from illness or injury and that do not qualify for further hospitalization, rehabilitations services, or nursing home care.

Blessing Bags

Several times a year, our employees fill "Blessing Bags" that are donated to various organizations. These bags are filled with hygiene supplies, water, snacks, and other needed essentials. In 2023, we provided local organizations with over 500 Blessing Bags, as well as 450 Laundry Kits. These laundry kits were filled with laundry essentials including quarters to be used at laundromats.

Affordable Housing Foundation

The Marquette Bank Affordable Housing Foundation has been helping families realize their dreams of home ownership by providing up to \$7,500 in grants for down-payment assistance and closing costs since 2009.



Health & Wellness

We provide food, donations, and volunteers to organizations that supply food to under-served residents in our neighborhoods.

Providing Lunches

Several times a year we pack lunches for different organizations within our neighborhoods. In 2023, our employees helped pack over 1,000 lunches.

Neighborhood Food Drive

Our 16th annual food drive allowed us to donate over 85 large boxes of food to several local food pantries. Employees participated in our annual Lunchtime to End Hunger Week by donating different canned or boxed items. Our Walk Against Hunger also encouraged employees and their loved ones to donate what they could. Along with the boxes of food, the bank was also able to donate \$3,500 in monetary donations.

Meals From The Heart

30 employee volunteers purchased ingredients and prepared meals on 5 separate dates for the Ronald McDonald House Charities in Oak Lawn. In total, over 90 volunteer hours were spent preparing and serving meals for resident families who had loved ones being cared for at the neighboring Advocate Children's Hospital.

We organized multiple opportunities to help support physical and mental well-being in our communities through projects that benefit our neighborhoods and welfare organizations.

Holiday Projects

Each year we collect donations to send "care packages" for troops stationed overseas for our **Adopt-A-Soldier Drive**. We also purchase gifts for our **Adopt-A-Family Holiday Project**. This year we were able to adopt 20 families (60 children and 32 adults) from 6 local organizations.

Employee Fundraising Walks


Employees participated in three different walks to raise money for local health and hunger organizations. Together, 66 employees walked almost 120 miles!

Toy Box Connection

Toy Box Connection is a local organization which serves as the bridge between families and businesses – providing toys and books to children in need. During the holiday season, we held a toy drive at our branches, where customers and employees donated over 1,250 toys. The majority of the toys were then given to Toy Box Connection.

Project Fire Buddies

As this local organization grows, we are proud to support its efforts through monetary donations as well as providing volunteers for events and activities. Founded by Oak Forest firefighters who wanted to support and bring joy to children struggling with serious illnesses; this organization is now in multiple states and has over 80 Chapters.
